Coast	Coastal	Where the land and sea meet.
County		A country is divided up into smaller parts called counties which have a local government. We live in the <b>county of Wiltshire.</b>
Country		An area of land controlled by a government.
Cornwall	Devon	Counties in England that have many seaside towns.
Human features		Features made by humans e.g. port, shop, harbour, pier.
Island		An area of land surrounded by sea.
Mainland		An area of land surrounded by other areas of land.
Physical features		Features that are part of our natural world e.g. cliff, coast, rock, beach, sea, sand.
Urban		A built up area – town or city.
Rural		An area with less population and many fields and farmland.
Town		A build up area with many houses to live – bigger than a village but smaller than a city.
