These learning objectives will be achieved through activities linked to our topics, where possible. We will also aim to incorporate children's interests when planning their learning©





Please remember:

- Bring your Reading Book to school every day (put your book bag in your drawer).
 Don't forget to record on the Boom Reader app every time you read at home.

Physical Development:

Develop fine motor skills:

- Using tools and equipment (eg. scissors, hole punches, tweezers, cutlery, draw simple pictures – Funky Fingers activities).
- Hold pencil/pen correctly and form recognisable letters.

Develop gross motor skills:

- Developing fundamentals (key skills) in PE using our outside area.
- Improving Body Management and Speed, Agility, Travel skills (The PE Hub)
- Forest Schools


Communication and Language:

- Enjoy listening in a range of situations and asking relevant questions.
- Following instructions involving several ideas or actions.
- Children will be able to express themselves clearly showing awareness of listeners' needs.
- Continue to develop vocabulary (and Makaton signing).
- Using language to tell a story during role play activities.
- Speaking in full sentences (using connectives).

PSED:

- Continue to understand how they are feeling (emotions)-using 'Zones of Regulation' chart.
- Developing a growth mindset (I can do it!).
- Understanding how to be healthy (sleep, eating, healthy teeth).

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- Listening to and joining in with an increasing range of stories and rhymes.
- Use language from a story when discussing it.
- Little Wandle phonics: Reading and writing tricky words (phase 2 and 3), adding some phase 4 words (Summer 1).
- Reading print from left to right, blending and segmenting sounds.
- Say a sound for all phase 2 and phase 3 phonemes. Begin to add phase 4 (adjacent consonants).
- Write all letters with correct formation.
- Write phase 2, phase 3 and some phase 4 words.
- Recognise rhyming words.
- Develop writing skills writing sentences that can be read by themselves and others.
- Write for a range of purposes –eg. messages & lists (role play), labels (plants), Drawing Club.

Characteristics of Effective Learning: Playing and Exploring

Children investigate and experience things and 'have a go'.

Understanding the World:



- Planting seeds and recognizing conditions needed for growth.
- Observing plant growth.
- Understanding the life cycle of a plant.
- Finding out about minibeasts.


Expressive Arts and Design:



- Singing familiar songs (and signing using Makaton).
- Charanga music scheme Big Bear Funk.
- Monet inspired paintings.
- Matisse inspired art work (collage).
- Observational drawings (flowers).

Characteristics of Effective Learning: Active Learning

Children concentrate and keep on trying if they encounter difficulties, they enjoy achievements.



- Recognising small amounts without counting (subitising up to 5).
- Recognising numerals to 20.
- Say numbers to 20 confidently.
- Recalling known composition of number (eg. how to make 4, 5, 6...).
- Continue to recall pairs of numbers that make 10 (for rapid recall).
- Building numbers beyond 10 and counting patterns beyond 10.
- Addition and subtraction number stories (First, Then, Now...).
- Recording addition and subtraction using number sentences (+, -. =).
- Developing spatial reasoning.
- Continuing MATHS PASSPORTS (to develop maths fluency).

Characteristics of Effective Learning: Creating and Thinking Critically

Children have and develop their own ideas, make links between ideas and develop strategies for doing things.
