Buildings Meeting

I attended a Buildings Meeting earlier this week to review the updated plans. We now have completed plans for the new infant classrooms, the Resource Base and a variety of other rooms that will be adapted within the main school. Next week, I will be meeting with the architects and the wider project team to go through the schedule of works in detail.

Work on the Children's Centre is due to begin shortly, meaning that, all being well, our youngest children will have their brand-new provision by Christmas.

We are preparing for the many changes that naturally come with a project of this scale, but this is an incredibly exciting and positive development for our school, and we look forward to sharing updates with you as work progresses.

An update from the Secretary of State

Last week, schools across the country were informed of a delay to this year's Key Stage 2 (KS2) test results.

Schools were due to receive results on 7 July 2026. However, Pearson Education Limited, the organisation responsible for administering, marking and returning KS2 results to schools, has informed the Department for Education of a delay affecting the national system used to make results available.

Results will now be available on 16 July 2026.

As a result, children in the rest of the school will receive their end-of-year reports on **Friday 10 July**, while Year 6 children will receive their reports on **Friday 17 July**.

Importantly, this delay is not related to the quality of the tests or the accuracy of pupils' results. Test papers have been marked in line with the usual processes.

This delay will not impact your child's transition to secondary school, and no action is required from parents, carers or pupils.
