Frogwell Primary School Newsletter

17th November 2023

Attendance

This week's whole-school attendance was 93.8%, which is a teeny tiny increase of +0.5% from last week. The top classes were:

1. King-Smith Class 96.9%

2. McKee Class 96.3%

3. Donaldson Class 96%

The highest attending class (or classes!) each week wins extra playtime or another activity chosen by the class. We have also introduced a bigger class prize/reward at the end of each term for the class that has the highest attendance overall for that term – last term it was Halls Class who chose some lovely new train set toys for their class as their prize. Who will it be this term? Please remember that the school is required to refer children who have 10 or more sessions of unauthorised absence to the Education Welfare Officer, and that each school day has two sessions. Non-uniform day 1st December

On Friday 1st December we are having a non-uniform day in exchange for items for the Christmas Fair tombola instead of money. Potter, EYFS and KS1 classes need to bring chocolate items. KS2 classes and McKee need to bring bottle items (alcohol is permitted but must handed in by an adult to the front office for secure storage - things like bubble bath can be collected in classes). Please make sure that children's chosen non-uniform outfits are still suitable for school, i.e. safe for active play and obviously nothing inappropriate.

Important reminders

- Long hair must be properly tied back for PE lessons and Forest Schools please due to safety. It is best if long hair is tied back all the time and school due to the risk of headlice spreading more easily, but for PE/Forest Schools it is essential.
- No hoop earrings or any other jewellery at school please a single pair of small stud earrings and a basic (non-smart) watch are all that is allowed, again for safety reasons and risk of loss/damage.

Dogs on school grounds

Please remember that dogs are actually not permitted anywhere on the school site, except assistance dogs. This includes dogs being carried as well as those walking. We have our own official visiting dog, Roko, who is risk assessed, carefully planned for and insured but other dogs may not enter the site. This includes the area around the car park and along the front of the school, not just in the playground. We also cannot have dogs tied up outside so any dog owners will need to make other arrangements for their animals during school drop off and pick up times.



Dangerous / inconsiderate parking

We are having some very serious issues with people parking in unsafe places or in ways that are disruptive to other road users / pedestrians. Anyone who is parking illegally (e.g. on double yellows) or in places that are likely to make things unsafe for children entering or leaving the school area will have their registration numbers noted and passed on to the police. Parking too close to the car park entrances or on double yellow lines puts our children at risk. Thank you to the many parents and carers who are noticing specific cars parking dangerously and alerting us – please keep reporting problems as we can only tackle this issue if we all work together to make sure the whole community understands it is not acceptable.

We all know the areas around all schools are very busy and congested at school drop-off and pick-up times, especially in the afternoon. Please make sure you arrive at school in time to park further away and walk up to school to collect your children – do not rely on arriving very close to 15.15 and expect to get a space in the car park. If the car park and the safer areas on Derriads Lane are taken, you will need to park further up the road and walk. Do not dump cars on the bends by the entrance/exit to the car park or on double yellow lines – you will have your car details passed on to the police.

Safeguarding

'Safeguarding' and 'Child Protection' are terms you may hear used a lot in schools and in the media, but what do they actually mean?

Safeguarding refers to the whole umbrella of processes we use to protect all children and to provide safe and effective care. This includes all the procedures designed to prevent harm to a child, including:

- Being alert to signs and symptoms of abuse or neglect and noticing changes in children's behaviour or presentation that suggests they may need support
- Carrying out risk assessments for activities and trips to ensure they are planned as safely as possible
- Health and safety checks to make sure the school environment is as safe as possible
- Following strict 'Safer Recruitment' procedures to make sure all staff and volunteers are suitable to work with children
- Helping children learn how to be safe online
- Teaching children about road safety, stranger danger, healthy lifestyles, safe and healthy relationships etc
- Making sure children have people they can talk to at school about worries, plus things like 'worry boxes' to make it easier to signal if something is wrong
- Checking where children are if they are not at school
- Improving children's attendance and punctuality at school because this impacts on their overall wellbeing
- Having pastoral systems to support children

Child Protection is part of the bigger safeguarding process, protecting specific individual children identified as suffering or likely to suffer significant harm. This includes the child protection procedures which detail how to respond to concerns about a child. The school has a legal obligation to report any concerns about a child if they feel that a child may be subject to neglect or physical, emotional or sexual abuse. This includes concerns about the child in the home and the wider environment. If we have such a concern, we will contact the Wiltshire Multi-Agency Safeguarding Hub (MASH) to ensure that concerns are dealt with in a manner which puts the well-being of the child as priority. We appreciate that parents and carers can find these events very worrying and upsetting. Whenever possible, we will discuss concerns with parents before seeking advice to safeguard a child; however, there are some circumstances when we are obliged to seek support from a professional trained to investigate safeguarding concerns.

Who is responsible for Safeguarding in school? The short answer is... EVERYONE!

<u>All staff and volunteers</u> are responsible for being alert to the signs of neglect and abuse and for reporting them to the Safeguarding Lead Team. All school staff have a responsibility to provide a safe environment in which children can learn. All staff receive safeguarding training and regular safeguarding updates in areas such as online safety and the Prevent duty. The <u>Safeguarding Lead</u> and <u>Deputy Safeguarding Lead</u> have additional multi-agency training so that they can carry out their responsibilities effectively. The Safeguarding Leads give advice to staff and also liaise closely with other services such as Children's Social Care.



Ofsted said...The arrangements for safeguarding are effective. Safeguarding records and practice are reviewed thoroughly. Leaders carry out the necessary safeguarding checks before staff begin working at the school. Staff and volunteers receive appropriate safeguarding training. They know how to report concerns about a pupil's safety and well-being. Safeguarding referrals to external agencies are made in a timely manner. Leaders escalate concerns if they believe they have not received an appropriate response from external agencies. Pupils are taught how to keep themselves safe. Leaders have plans in place to help develop further pupils' understanding of bullying, including cyber-bullying.

Fire Service visit

Donaldson, Potter, Halls and Dahl Classes had a fantastic visit from Wiltshire and Dorset Fire Service this afternoon! As part of our wider Personal Development and PSHE curriculum offer, each class had a workshop with the firefighters where they looked around the fire engine to see what they would use to put out a fire and they dressed a firefighter up to show the safety gear they wear. Year 1 and Year 2 learnt about when and how you would call the fire brigade and how to leave a building if it is on fire; they also learnt about smoke detectors as a precaution. The fire crew also showed the children a quieter siren and the flashing blue lights that they would see when they are responding to an emergency. All the children got to sit up in the cab and the Reception children even got to use the water hose, which was super-exciting! Today's visit is being followed up by Fire Talk visits to class for Years 2, 4 and 6 the week after next. Thank you to Mrs Andrews, our PSHE Leader, for organising this event and working with the classes all afternoon to make it such a success.
