Science: Seasonal Changes – Spring

Key Vocabulary	
Seasons	In the U.K, there are 4 seasons a year. These are spring, summer, autumn and winter.
Spring	In spring, the weather starts to get warmer. Leaves begin to grow and some trees may blossom. The days start to have more daylight hours.
Weather	The weather includes the temperature outside, how windy it is and the rainfall.
Temperature	Temperature is a measure of how hot or cold something is.
Daylight	Daylight is when it is light outside. The amount of daylight changes with each season.
