Science: Living things and their habitats

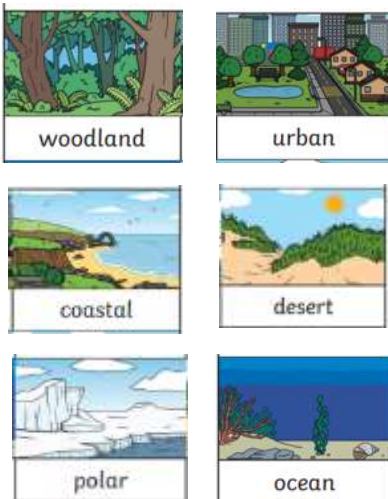
Key Vocabulary	
Living	Animals and plants are living things. All living things need to have their basic needs met in order to survive.
Never alive	Things made of metal, plastic, glass or rock were never living because they did not move by themselves, grow or need food.
Basic Needs	Basic needs are what living things require to stay alive.
Habitat	A habitat is a natural place where something lives. A habitat provides living things with everything they need to survive.
Microhabitat	A microhabitat is a very small habitat where minibeasts live.
Food chain	A food chain shows how each animal gets its food. Food chains show how living things depend on each other to stay alive.
Food sources	Food sources are the things that living things eat.
